About Us

North Douglas County Fire & EMS is situated in the beautiful north end of Douglas County, Oregon. The department provides both fire and EMS protection to the communities of Curtin, Drain, Yoncalla, Rice Hill, and parts of Oakland, while also providing EMS protection to the Elkton and Kellogg populations.

North Douglas County Fire & EMS responded to about 1,100 requests for emergency assistance in 2018, with 90% of them being medical-related emergencies and 10% of them being fire-related emergencies. We operate out of six fire stations that are strategically placed within our jurisdiction to provide the quickest response possible. Our station #1 location in Drain is the only station that is staffed 24/7, with the other five stations serving as non-staffed, volunteer stations. Our department employs a fire chief, assistant fire chief, and office manager that works Monday through Thursday from the main station in Drain. We also employ three full-time firefighter/paramedics who rotate through our 48/96 hour schedule and serve as our shift supervisors. We also have approximately 15 EMS volunteers that sign up for 12 hour shifts throughout the month and about 15 fire volunteers that respond from home to any fire-related emergency.

North Douglas County offers a central hub for travelers headed to the coast in Interstate 5 and Highway 38. Our jurisdiction is home to the largest stretch of Interstate 5 in the state (at just under 28 miles). The communities of Elkton and Kellogg are home to some of the best fishing spots on the Umpqua River and the river tour guide industry has grown substantially in recent years. The river also provides locals a great spot to visit during the summer months for a quick dip, river floating, or a Saturday picnic. Additionally, North Douglas County has recently been home to a growing wine industry in the Willamette Valley.



Student Program Description

The North Douglas County Fire & EMS Student Firefighter/EMT Program is intended for individuals looking for a hands-on experience while enrolled in school directed towards a career in the Fire or EMS service. The program is designed to reflect what the student will experience during their pursuit to become professional firefighters and EMT's. This is accomplished with assignment to 48 hour shifts with career staff, participating in District training, and periodic individual evaluations on performance.

Our student program members are given exacting training and professional supervision. They are expected to perform their assigned duties and are held accountable for doing so. Students are expected to assist fire department staff with both emergency and non-emergency service activities. This includes, but is not limited to: emergency response, fire prevention activities, hydrant and hose testing, vehicle and station maintenance, and regular training. Graduates of the program find themselves to be highly competitive for future job openings in the fire and medical fields.

Program members are college students attending the accredited school of their choice as a full-time student. Students will be considered a part of the "on-duty" crew and will be required to work days, evenings, weekends, and/or holidays. Shifts are 48 hours in duration with 96 hours off in between shifts. They are given time off to attend their classes, provided required uniforms and equipment, trained to exacting standards, and will be able to use department vehicles for transportation to and from all school-related activities.



Housing/Facilities

As part of your student program experience, we highly recommend that you live inside or near our fire district. While on shift you will stay at our Station #1 living quarters. Inside the "annex" we have four personal bedrooms, private showers, a full-use kitchen, personal laundry services, big screen TV, high-speed internet, and a quiet training room that you can use to study in. If a student is interested in living at our rural station in Curtin full-time on their days off, arrangements can be made on an individualized basis.

Student Program Criteria

- * Students must be at least 18 years of age at time of application
- * High School Diploma or GED
- Possess and maintain a valid driver's license, have three years of driving experience, and possess an acceptable driving record
- * Students must go to school full-time (12+ credits) at an accredited institution of their choice and working towards a degree in either Fire Science and/or Emergency Medical Technology. Students must attend school at least three terms a year (most students take summer term off)
- Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA each term and submit a copy of their term-byterm transcript at the conclusion of each school term for verification of GPA.
- * Students must display levels of physical fitness required to perform essential fire and EMS duties
- Students must be able to pass a background check, medical examination, drug screen, and respiratory fit test (yearly)

Student Benefits

- \$1500 reimbursement tuition stipend per term to help cover the costs of school
- Up to \$500 reimbursement stipend per term to cover the cost of books/supplies
- * Potential dorm space for living in a fire station (first-come, first-served basis)
- * Gain valuable workplace experience
- * Uniforms and equipment are furnished for regular duty work
- * Term-by-term mentorship and assistance in meeting graduation requirements
- Training for required skills and advancement
- Possible fire training includes: NFPA Firefighter I + II, NFPA Driver, Wildland Firefighter I + II, Wildland Engine/Crew Boss, Hazmat Awareness/Operations/Incident Commander, etc.
- EMS training includes: EMT Basic, biannual CPR/First Aid Certification, EMT refresher training for biannual recertification
- Other trainings include: ICS 100, 200, 700, 800

Program Rules and Regulations

- Student agrees to abide by all federal, state, local, and department rules, regulations, procedures, and guidelines regarding emergency response and workplace behavior.
- Student understands that use of alcohol or other illicit substances while on duty or on department property (including student station) is strictly prohibited.
- Students are restricted to four years in the program as an undergraduate student
- Students must be willing to work their assigned ten 24 hour shifts each month
- If a student chooses to live at our student station in Curtin, they will be required to sign up for ten 12 hour "reserve duty shifts", in addition to their ten 24 hour "on-duty shifts".
- Students must attend 75% of the monthly fire and medical drills offered unless there is a direct conflict with their student schedule.

Student will be exempt from the daily schedule any time they must leave shift to travel to and from school and attend scheduled classes.

Primary Duties/Job Requirements

- Follows all department standards, policies, procedures, guidelines, and safety rules as outlined in federal, state, and local regulations, as well as by the District for such activities.
- Performs duties in a manner which positively reflects on the fire district.
- Performs housekeeping and maintenance duties at the station as assigned.
- Assists with duties peripheral to emergency incident scenes, depending on conditions and if so directed.
- Responds to a multitude of alarms, performs all necessary duties as a firefighter and EMT including, but not limited to, the operation of equipment, emergency apparatus, and tools necessary to complete the task at hand and all other activities as required.
- May be asked to remove people from danger and perform emergency life support functions, including the care and transportation of sick and injured up to the individual's level of training and certification.
- Participates in fire district training and attends classes on techniques and other emergency topics as required to maintain necessary skills and proficiency levels as required by state and district standards.
- May be asked to perform fire prevention and public education tasks as assigned.
- Compiles, writes, and submits required reports by computer and by hand for emergency and non-emergency activities to various individuals as needed.
- Responds to the general public regarding questions and help following district policies and procedures in a courteous and respectful manner.
- Performs tasks that involve exposure to blood, body fluids, or tissues that may be infectious with various Hepatitis Virus and Human Immunodeficiency Virus. Involves exposure to both indoor and outdoor environment including occasional exposure to extremes in temperature, dust, noise, and other adverse psychological conditions.
- Keeps assigned stations, apparatus, and equipment in a constant state of readiness, may be asked to do apparatus inspections and perform necessary maintenance and/or repair.
 Maintains records and submits reports as required.
- Has the ability to drive an emergency vehicle during both day and night in situations involving congested traffic and in unsafe conditions as created by environmental factors.
- Performs other duties as assigned.
